TERMS AND APPLICATION DEADLINES

WINTER / SPRING: Term begins in January (All campuses are quarter system: Winter & Spring, except UCB Spring SEMESTER). Completed applications must be received by UCEAP by the following date:

JULY 18, 2025 application completed for review by the UCEAP Bologna Study Center

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY EXAMINATIONS:

All courses at UC (except for foreign language courses) are taught in English. If your native language is not English, or your high school or college/university education has been in a country where the language of instruction was not in English, you must provide evidence of a sufficient level of English proficiency (see below). Students with US citizenship are not exempt from this requirement.

If you attend an institution where the language of instruction is English, located in a country where English is the official language of instruction, you are not required to submit proof of English-language proficiency.

Exams and Minimum Score Required

Duolingo English Test (DET): 115

Internet-Based TOEFL: 80 for all campuses except UCLA, UCSD, UCD: 83

IELTS: 6.5 for all campuses except UCLA, UCSD, UCD: 7.0
